Safe Drinking Water

WTHS is ramping up efforts to encourage and ensure students and staff have adequate safe drinking water while contributing to the Green Team commitment. Currently four operation stations (one in the M-Hallway, two outside the cafeteria, one outside the auditorium) are servicing the school population. Also, plans are in motion to install a fifth station in the J-Hallway. Safe drinking water is essential for proper hydration, cognitive function, and overall health. These stations provide access to fresh, filtered water, which can help prevent waterborne diseases and improve overall well-being. In addition to their many health benefits, using one of these water refill stations on a regular basis eliminates the need to buy bottled water and reduces plastic waste. Water refill stations are also beneficial to the environment as they eliminate the need for single-use plastic bottles that end up in landfills and oceans. For example, the two stations outside the cafeteria have saved over 45,000 plastic bottles from ending up in the trash and the eventual landfills and oceans.



Green Initiative

Mr. Palumbo is super proud of his students in his Arts and Crafts II class for helping Winslow's Green Initiative by building architectural maquettes from recycled materials. They used measurements and geometry to create symmetrical structures that stand on their own and feel aesthetically well designed. 
