

NHS FAQ's

1. When can students apply to NHS?

Students cannot apply to NHS, they must be invited to be considered for membership. Letters are mailed to juniors who are eligible. This occurs in November.

2. What GPA do you need to be eligible?

Cumulative GPA of a 3.6 or above. Less than 3.6 GPA's will not be rounded up. This GPA needs to be maintained until graduation in order to retain membership and wear a stole for the commencement ceremony.

3. Who decides who gets in?

A group of five WTHS staff members make up the NHS Faculty Council. They are the voting body of NHS. The two NHS advisors are not on the Faculty Council and cannot vote on membership selection.

4. What happens if a junior does not get in? Can they reapply as seniors?

Yes, they can reapply if their cumulative GPA is still a 3.6 or above at the end of their Junior year.
